GEORGE the FOURTH, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith.

To our trusty and well-beloved the Honorable WILLIAM CAMPBELL, Chief Justice of our Legislative Council. said Province.

GREETING:

KNOW YE, that as well for the especial trust and confidence that we have manifested for you, as for the purpose of obtaining your advice and assistance in all weighty and arduous affairs, which may the state and defence of our said Province of Upper Canada, and the Church thereof, concern, we have thought fit to summon you to the Legislative Council of our said Province; and we do therefore command you, the said William Campbell, that, all difficulties and execuses whatsoever laying aside, you be and appear, for the purposes aforesaid, at the Legislative Council of our said Province, at all times whensoever and wheresoever our Provincial Parliament may be therein hereafter convoked and holden, and this you are in no wise to omit.

In testimony whereof, we have caused these our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of our said Province to be hereunto affixed. Witness, our trusty and well-beloved SIR PEREGRINE MAITLAND, K.C.B. Lieutenant Governor of our said Province, and Major General Commanding our Forces therein, at York, the tenth day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventh ycar of our Reign.
