45. If any person against whom any such complaint, as in Certificate or either of the last two preceding sections mentioned, has been pre-shall be a bar ferred, by or on the behalf of the party aggrieved, has obtained to any other such certificate, or, having been convicted, has paid the whole proceedings. amount adjudged to be paid or has suffered the imprisonment, or imprisonment with hard labour awarded, in every such case he shall be released from all further or other proceedings, civil or criminal, for the same cause.

47. Whosoever is convicted upon an indictment, of any assault Assault Occaoccasioning actual bodily harm, shall be liable to be imprisoned in harm. the Penitentiary for any term not exceeding three years and not less than two years, or to be imprisoned in any other gaol or place of confinement for any term less than two years, with or without hard labour; and whosoever is convicted upon an indictment for a common assault, shall be liable to be imprisoned in any gaol or Common place of confinement, other than a Penitentiary, for any term not exceeding one year, with or without hard labour.

District, County, Division, City or place, nor any Judge of the not to try oer-Sessions of the Peace, nor the Recorder of any City, shall, at any Session of the Peace, or at any adjournment thereof, try any person for any offence under the twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth, or twenty-ninth Sections of this Act.

Rape, abduction and defilement of women.

- 49. Whosoever commits the crime of rape is guilty of felony, Rape. and shall suffer death as a felon.
- 50. Whosoever by false pretences, false representations, or Procuring the other fraudulent means, procures any woman or girl under the defilement of age of twenty-one years, to have illicit carnal connection with any man other than the procurer, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be liable to be imprisoned in any gaol or place of confinement, other than a Penitentiary, for any term less than two years, with or without hard labour,
