Until this equipment has been completed, develop-ment will be continued by hand, and the shaft will be sunk to the greatest depth economically possible by that method, or perhaps 75 feet. A level or "drift" will then be driven on course of the vein west-

ward from bottom of the shaft. This level extended to a point beneath the west end of the 500 feet of ground included in the preliminary surface exploration where the rich assays in October, ranging as high as \$69.50 per ton were obtained, will have, perhaps, 200 feet of ore ground overhead; it will also have opened up the vein between the two points so that the overhead ore can be economically extracted.
