

### STAKED SITE FOR HATCHERY

Engineer From Toronto Gets New Institution Going Near Simcoe.

### ANOTHER MOTOR ACCIDENT

Little Four-Year-Old Boy Shaken Up, But Not Badly Hurt.

Simcoe, June 22.—Engineer Tallord, of the Fisheries Department, Toronto, arrived in town this morning with plans, and accompanied by Gamo and Fisheries Warden, Dr. Wm. Burt, proceeded to Normandale and staked out the ground for the new hatchery to be built there.

**Dam to be Built**  
A dam will be constructed about a quarter of a mile west of the hatchery to create a basin of water for cooling purposes and the water will be conveyed across by a run-way. The capacity will be about 120,000,000 fish annually, principally herring and white fish, and the young will be placed in the lake as hatched.

**By Day Labor**  
The plant will be constructed by day labour under Dr. Burt's supervision, and work will begin at once. The gravel is on the ground already.

Athens, via London, June 23.—There is general satisfaction shown among the public over the result of the ultimatum sent to King Constantine by the Entente. ### SECRET SESSION ENDORSES GOV

Chamber of Deputies France Stands by the Cabinet.

By Special Wire to the Courier.

Paris, June 23.—The French Chamber of Deputies has come safely out of the deal of the secret session. The chamber of deputies at a public sitting last night gave the government vote of confidence by 440 to 97.

The secret proceedings, which lasted over seven sittings, were welcomed both by the government which was enabled to explain actions freely and by its critics, by reason of the exigencies of the national defence had been unable to give particulars to support complaints in a public session.

Most Valuable Information. On the resumption of the session, several motions were by the president, only one of which, however, was accepted by the chamber. This was a lengthy motion drafted jointly by the presidents of the different groups after expressing confidence in government, set forth that the sessions had given the members the chamber a valuable insight into the general conduct of the war that the chamber had decided to situate and organize a delegation to exercise with the assistance of government, a direct general control on all services supplying the army at all points, front rear.

**Confidence in Government.** While having no intention of interfering with the conception, execution or execution of the military operations, the chamber held it its duty to see that preparation for an offensive and defensive, both industrial and military, was carried on with a care, energy foresight commensurate with the heroism of the soldiers of the front line.

After the passage, expressing confidence in the government was voted, the motion as a whole was adopted 444 to 89.

**Socialists' Motion Not Voted.** A motion introduced by the socialist, Leon Accambray, calling for the appointment of a committee of forty-four to investigate and report on the conduct of the war and relations between the High command and the public authorities, with view to taking steps if necessary to organize and control parliament the best interests of national defence, was not voted on.
