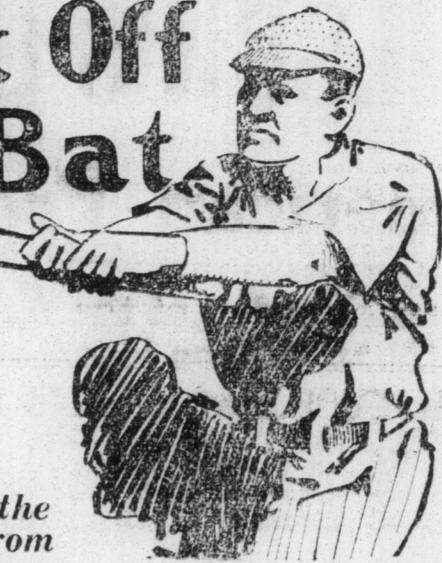

THE WAR NEWS OF THE YEAR 1946

Trench Newspaper Looks For Lengthy Duration of the Struggle

What kind of war news will the newspapers print thirty years from now—provided the war lasts that long? A French newspaper, Le Diable au Cor, the official organ of a brave and frolicsome corps of crack Alpine riflemen, does not hesitate in its latest issue, to risk an answer to this question. The following bits of news, according to the editor are taken from Le Matin, of November 10th, 1946:

"After thirty-two years of hostilities the central committee of the Social democratic has once more affirmed its fidelity to the imperial government and put on Belgium the responsibility for the war.

"Army men have been authorized

by the commander-in-chief to add 40 centimetres to the length of their coat sleeves in order to make room for the regulation stripes. (A stripe is at present added to every soldier's sleeve for each six months of service at the front, and a stripe on the right arm for each successive wound.)

"It has been noticed that the majority of young recruits are illiterate. For this reason the commander-in-chief has issued a circular ordering night classes to be held in the trenches.

"As the Boches have sunk four more passenger steamers belonging to the United States. President Roosevelt, who has just succeeded Mr. Hughes, has sent Emperor William an eloquent little note, to which, so far, he has received no reply. This note is No. 2,687.

"To utilize the live forces of the nation, the Government recently formed a volunteer corps of legless men. The president of the republic in the presence of a multitude of people, on the Esplanade des Invalides, presented the flag to this corps of elite.

"Honourat, the deputy who in 1916 drafted a bill to advance the clock an hour in summer, has now proposed a law to suppress provis-

ionally, the months of December, January and February, which, owing to a lack of combustibles, are particularly trying for the poor. Everyone admits the urgency of the proposition.

"In Greece there is loud talk of the abdication of Venizelos I. One, Constantine, by name, who for the last 30 years has lived at Aix-les-Bains in a furnished house, has landed at Saloniki as the head of a detachment of ferocious republicans.

"An escadrille of 10,000 aeroplanes, commanded by Gen. Navarre, last Friday succeeded in performing a wonderful feat. By means of harpoons our aviators caught a division of cavalry in the environs of Schlesiadt, and, with their horses, arms, and luggage, transported them to Puy-de-Dome.

"The commissariat had furnished each soldier with a knife called 'a Swiss army knife.' This knife has eighteen blades, varying in size; a circular saw, a drill, a hammer, a pedometer, an automatic weighing machine, a salad basket and a shower-bath apparatus.

"The second railway line of the submarine tunnel connecting Cher-

bourg with New York was inaugurated on Friday.

"To increase the ration of meat allowed civilians in the rear who suffer more and more from the diminution of live stock, the commissariat has decided to ship daily to the Paris markets twelve complete carloads of rats from the trenches. Rats, as everyone knows, constitute a most delicate diet. Doubtless they will soon be seen in fashionable restaurants and on the tables of the greatest epicures."

A worker in London writes: "I see here, the effect of the suffering of these noble people, they would be willing to give up every unnecessary thing they have to relieve it. The men, poor that though they may be for the militaristic Germans, are the homeless and penniless, must be fed and stuff that heroes are made of, and ask nothing but a chance to fight until the invader is expelled from their land."

"But the women, though their spirit is as brave, must wait, and while they wait they must depend on the love of their allies and neighbors to keep them alive. We are taking care of as many of them as we can here, but we cannot bring all of them over, and those who remain for the homeless and penniless, must be fed in Belgium.

The relief committee leaves nothing undone to make every bag of flour and every cent of money bring in its return of life to these people, and it asks only that the Canadians and others show their gratitude for the self-sacrifice of the Belgians by keeping up the good work of sending more, and still more, money and goods to care for them.
