SHOCKING TRAGEDY

The most shocking crime ever enacted in Nova Scotia was that which was committed Sunday morning at Simpson's corner, near New Germany, Lunenburg County, when Havelock Veinott, a man about 40 years of age, became enraged over a dispute as to the dam rights and murdered his father, William Veinott; Albert Ritcey, Mrs. Adelia Ritcey and Archibald Snider. He then committed suicide. The whole country was stirred when the details of the revolting and brutal murder were ascertained. The tragedy took place between 6 and 7 o'clock in the morning.
