

### War Office Spent More Than \$7,500,000 in Canada.

OTTAWA, June 13.—The following are the amounts of food stuffs which have been supplied by Canada on account of the Imperial war office up to June 5, 1902:

Hay, 195,699 tons; flour, 125,815 sacks; beef, 40,776 cases; mutton, 11,743 cases; oats, 294,772 bags. Three ship loads of hay are yet to go forward this month. Besides the supplies there have been several consignments of manufactured goods sent by private means. The above goods represent an expenditure by the war office in Canada of more than \$7,500,000.

### HERO'S DEATH.

**Drowned While Trying to Save Little Girl in Rideau Canal.**

OTTAWA, June 13.—Capt. L. H. Poult, clerk in the post office department, was drowned in the Rideau Canal yesterday in attempting to save the life of a little niece who got beyond her depth. The deceased was a son of Mr. Poult, a former M. P. for Ontario county.

### MONT PEELE IN ERUPTION.

**Active Saturday Morning—Ashes Fall on Quebec from miles away.**

ROSAIE, Island of Dominica, June 14.—The French revenue cutter L'Alge came in here today. She reports that while passing Cape Ferret, Martinique, at 2 o'clock this morning, an eruption occurred from Mont Pelee and that a quantity of volcanic matter landed upon the vessel's decks, although she was 10 miles distant from the island.

### Increase in Postal Rates.

**How Postmaster Mulock Expects to Make the Department Self-Sustaining.**

OTTAWA, June 15.—Postmaster General Mulock left for England yesterday and no sooner does he get on ship than it is announced that the postal rates are to be increased. Except on letters practically the rates are doubled on every class of mail matter. Not long ago Premier Laurier announced that the postal service would soon be self-sustaining, but it was never thought that this would be attained by Mulock's ill-advised measures.

### SOUTH AFRICA.

**Over Sixteen Thousand Boers Have Already Surrendered.**

LONDON, June 15.—A despatch from Lord Kitchener, dated Pretoria, Saturday, June 14th, says: 2,394 Boers have surrendered since Friday, June 14, and that everything is proceeding most satisfactorily.

LONDON, June 16.—Despatches received here from South Africa show that the surrenders of Boers are proceeding with the greatest good will. The total of the number who have already surrendered is 16,500, and the British are extending every possible kindness to the men and women.

The appearance of General De Wet at the camp at Wilburg was the signal for a great display of enthusiasm. When he arrived at the camp then De Wet was at once surrounded by thousands of Boers, men, women and children, who struggled and clamored to shake the hand of their hero. Gen. De Wet mounted a table and delivered an address. He warmly appreciated the staunch support that the women had given the burghers during the war which, he said, had greatly encouraged the men in the field. Continuing, Gen. De Wet recommended his hearers to be loyal to the new government, and said:

"Perhaps it is hard for you to hear this from my mouth, but God has decided this. I fought until there was no hope of upholding our cause, and now I am bitter. It may be, the time has come to lay down our arms. As a Christian people God now demands that we be faithful."

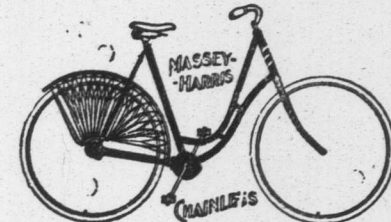

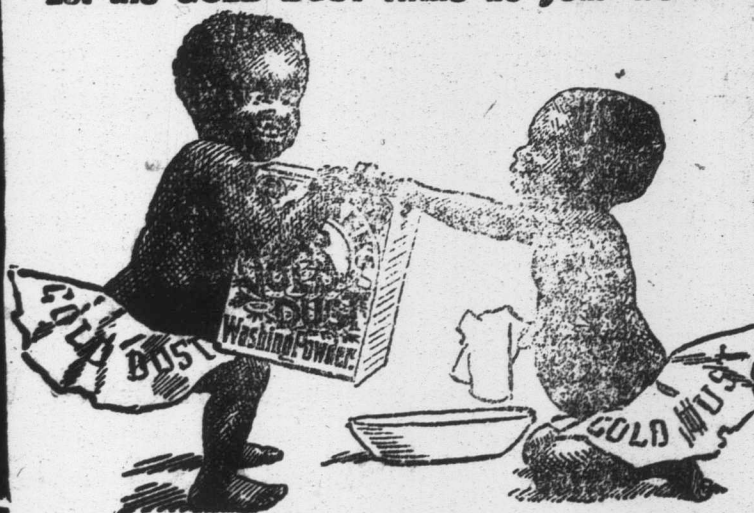
