sight of Front-de-Bœuf himself is  
less odious to me than thou, de-  
graded and degenerate as thou  
art.'

periority, that the wretch before thee  
is the daughter of thy father's  
friend. Go thy way—if I am sepa-

and wilt thou now yield to despair  
when thine eyes are opened to thy  
crimes, and when repentance were  
thy fitter occupation.'  
'Cedric,' answered Ulrica, 'thou  
little knowest the human heart. To  
act as I have acted, to think as I  
have thought, requires the madden-  
ing love of pleasure, mingled with  
the keen appetite of revenge, the  
proud consciousness of power;  
draughts too intoxicating for the

has no pleasures, wrinkles have no  
influence, revenge itself dies away  
in impotent rages. Then comes  
remorse, with all its vipers, mixed
