### Confirmation.

His Grace Archbishop Howley accompanied by Rt. Rev. Mons. Roche visited Topsail Parish on Sunday, Oct. 22nd. The purpose of their coming was to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation. At 12 o'clock the Pastor, Rev. J. Condy, met the distinguished party at Topsail Church where a large gathering had assembled. Old and young came long distances and from various quarters quickened by the desire to see and hear His Grace and to honor him as their beloved Archbishop as well as to be present during the administering of this excellent and life-increasing Sacrament. His Grace in the beginning, and at considerable length, explained the nature, purpose, efficacy of Confirmation as far as it was necessary for all to know, and in language simple, clear and inspiring unfolded the beautiful teaching of Holy Church on this subject which was earnestly listened to by a large and devout congregation. When he had finished his touching discourse about 40 children were presented for Confirmation. Once more they were exhorted to live good Christian lives, to be faithful to the obligations contracted through the reception of this Sacrament and to conform their lives as far as possible to the teachings of Holy Church embodied in the Gospel.

At 2 o'clock the distinguished party left for Kelligrews where about the same number of children were eagerly awaiting His Grace's approach. In his own inimitable and lucid manner he also expounded the teaching of the Church concerning this Sacrament instituted by Christ. Then 40 children received Confirmation and were sent away as little Soldiers of Christ, strengthened in the faith and ready to fight the fight of Christians in the battle of life. It was a pleasing sight to behold so many bright young children attentively listening to every word uttered by His Grace and to receive from him a Sacrament which added to their innocent, unsullied souls additional lustre.

His Grace was highly pleased with the reception the people gave him and took occasion to praise them for their faith and for the respect manifested by them toward the Chief Pastor of their souls; their faith was shown by their presence and attention, their respect by the decorations and arches everywhere witnessed. The day was exceptionally fine and the auto drive all along the shore delightful. The distinguished visitors before returning to town were dined at Power's Court, the Pastor's home, thus was brought to a close a very busy and pleasant day in this picturesque locality.

**FIFTY-NINE WHALES.**—The whaler Cabot, operating at Snook's Arm, has now 59 whales ashore. Capt. He will continue the voyage cruising in these waters as long as the weather conditions permit.

**OTTAWA, Oct. 24.**

It is believed in some quarters that a subcommittee on the Naval Question may be coupled with a General Election two years from now, after the Redistribution Bill has been put through Parliament. Advocates of the plan claim that, with so strong a majority, Premier Borden's Government will run no risk in making the appeal to the people, and that it would come back with its base of power considerably extended.

### Prevent Rolling of Steamships.

London, Oct. 23.—The Cunard company is having new anti-rolling devices installed in the Laconia which is being completed at Wallsend. If the experiment proves to be successful similar devices will be fitted in the giant liner Aquitania now building at Clyde bank.
