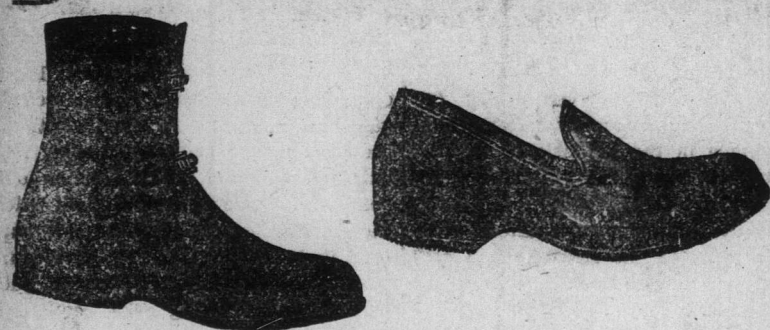

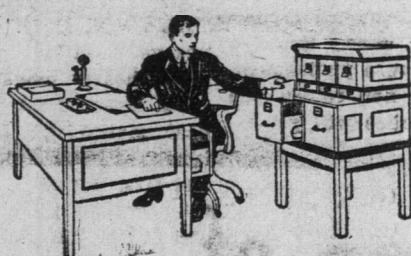

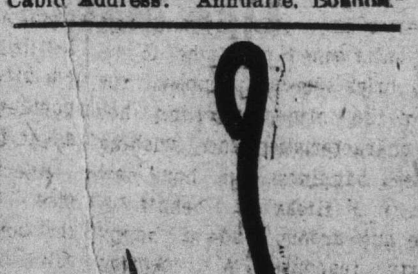

Sloan-Duployan Shorthand Competition

In the Semi-Annual International Shorthand Competitions held last December in connection with the Sloan-Duployan Shorthand Society (headquarters, Ramsgate, England), two Newfoundland competitors have been successful. In Class II, Miss Ada Barnes, of Allandale Road, St. John's, gains one of the four silver medals awarded for the best specimens in reporting style, accuracy. In Class III, Miss Bella Buckley, of 89 Military Road, St. John's, gains the only gold centre medal for the best note and transcript at 150 words per minute.

Both of these successful candidates are pupils in the Commercial Department of the Convent of Mercy, Military Road. Quite a large number of medals have been gained by the pupils of this academy, although on this occasion the highest award of all, the gold medal in Class IV, does not come to Newfoundland. The Federated Malay States have secured this trophy, the successful candidate being Mr. John Chellappah, of Kuala Lumpur.

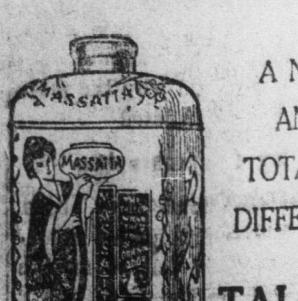
