House of Assembly.

June 1, 1920.

The House met at 3 p.m. Petitions were presented by Messrs. Walsh and McDonnell, the latter from 900 residents of St. George's District asking for a modification of the Prohibition Act.

The Minister of Justice moved the House into committee of the whole to consider certain resolutions respecting the improvement bill of roads. This is the bill foreshadowed by the petition from the Motor Association last week. Mr. Warren said he introduced it not as a Government measure, but at the request of the above association or a number of gentlemen connected therewith.

At the suggestion of Mr. Higgins the further discussion was deferred and the committee rose to enable members to become acquainted with the provisions of the resolutions.

The Minister of Marine and Fisheries introduced a bill to amend the Pilotage Act, 1917.

QUESTIONS:

Mr. Bennett—To ask the Hon. Minister of Posts and Telegraphs if Miss Edith Brown, Postmistress at Tilton, C.B., sister of ex-Private David Brown, M.M., has been notified of her dismissal from the public service and if so state cause for such dismissal.

Minister of Posts not present. Reply will be tabled to-morrow.

Mr. Walsh—To ask the Hon. the Prime Minister: (a) If it is the intention of the Government to create a Department of Labor; (b) When said department will be established; (c) Will legislation in connection with said establishment be introduced at the present session of the Legislature.

Reply—It is the intention of the Government to introduce a bill relating to the adjustments of disputes between employer and employee. A department of labor will not be created but the bill will call for the appointment of a board.

The Council's amendments to the Survey of Foreign Going Vessels' Bill was read a second time.

Third readings were given the "Preservation of Beavers" Bill and the Act respecting the "Postal and Telegraph Services" Bill.

The House then went into committee on the "Licenses to Cut Hardwood" Bill. Amendments were made to Section 3, protecting the three mile limit. No license will be granted to cut on the three mile limit unless three months notice be given in the Royal Gazette, and no license shall be granted if 40 p.c. of the electors in any area register a protest against such license being granted.

The "Alison" Bill was put through committee, and the House adjourned until to-day at the usual hour.

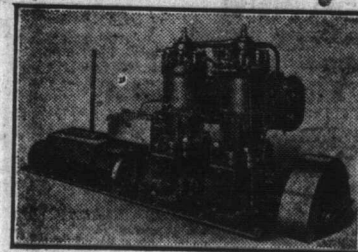

Council Will Oil Some Roads.

Some 300 barrels of crude oil, for use on streets, ordered by the Municipal Council, will arrive shortly. LeMarchant Road first and then Waterford Bridge Road will be oiled. The Council's jurisdiction over the latter extends only as far as Syme's Bridge, but the Council is making a proposition with the Government whereby it (the Council) would continue the oil past Syme's Bridge and pay for it, the Government later refunding the amount expended. The reply of the Government is expected in a few days.
