New Brunswick is waking up to the importance of having its unoccupied lands settled, and its extensive forests transferred into homesteads for the industrious emigrant. To this end the Government has decided that whenever ten intending settlers on new land, whether natives or otherwise, may select 100 acre lots of land and cut down and burntwoacres each, the lots shall be granted them; \$15 in cash given to each of them, and roads constructed to their location.
