At Brantford the party were driven to Victoria Sjuare, where an address was read, and from there to the Central School, where about 1,500 pupils were assembled, and an address was presented on their behalf. Leaving here, tho Governor proceeded to the south of the town, and turned the first god of the Brantford and Port Burwell Kailway. The new Presbyterian Ladies' Collego was next visited and Lady Dufferin laid the inscription stone. At the Blind Asylum the Governor was presented with a sheet of music written or rather em-bo s d by one of the pupils, who played e selection on a cabinet organ.

At Oskwekca, about 3,000 Indians were present, and a Chief made an address to His Excellency in Indian. It was trans-lated by an interpreter and briefly re-plied to. After an address by another Chief the Governor made a lengthy ad-dress to the Indians. An address was also presented from the Six Nations Ag-ricultural Society. A portrait of Brant, for Prince Arthur, was given in charge of His Excellency. After a genuine war dance a lunch was served, to which Hon. Oliver Mowat, as well as the Vice-Regal party, sat down. Bow Park was visited at half-past three, and the party enter-tained by the Hon. George Brown. Re-turning to Brantford at nine o'clock, their Excellencies held a reception, at which many were presented. Fergus Correspondence.
