OTTAWA WAITS THE WORST

A New Great Seal of Canada is Now Being Prepared.

Ministers Drafting Messages of Sympathy and Congratulation—New Forms Being Prepared For Use on the Accession of a King—Oath of Allegiance to Be Administered to Governor-General and Lieutenant-Governors Being Arranged.

Ottawa, Jan. 22.—Up to noon yesterday no official message concerning Her Majesty's condition had been received at Government House, but anxious hearts await the final announcement with heaviness and gloom. The Ministers who are in town were all awaiting news in their own rooms until 2:30, when the Cabinet met. A momentary message expressing sympathy and also congratulation has been drafted for submission to Council, and this, when the proper moment arrives, will be forwarded to the Colonial Office for presentation to the new sovereign.

In the Secretary of State's Department all his hurry and bustle. The proclamation announcing the death of a sovereign and that proclaiming the accession of his successor have been looked up, and new forms prepared ready for use. The great seal, too, becomes obsolete with the death of the Queen, as it bears the legend "Victoria Dei Gratia," etc., and a new one is being designed and prepared, so that the business of the state can be carried forward. There are numerous small details to be considered, for which precedents are being looked up; for instance, the change of the word Queen to King in notices, proclamations, etc.

So far nothing has been done in regard to the draping of the Houses of Parliament and public buildings, though these matters will receive immediate attention. The chambers of the two Houses will probably be left till later, as Parliament is not likely to meet before the day for which it is called, namely, Feb. 8.

Arrangements will be made to-day for administering the oath of allegiance to His Excellency the Governor-General, the Lieutenant-Governors of the provinces and the Dominion Ministers. As the members of the Commons have not been sworn in, the oath to which they will subscribe will be altered before they sign it.

The arrangements for military display and mourning will all be made in England and authorized from there. There will probably be the firing of minute guns at all points where artillery are available at certain hours from the time of death to that of interment, especially during the lying in state; the customary mourning for the troops, namely, the draping of colors, the wearing of a chevron of crepe on the arm, and the draping of the hilts of the officers' swords in crepe, tied with black sarsenet, and the covering with crepe of any ornaments on the cross belts.

Her Majesty's Last Appearance.

The one subject of conversation in the home, on the street, and in the business places, is the Queen's illness. Many recalled to mind the fact that one of Her Majesty's last appearances in public was made on the occasion of her review of the Canadian troops returning from South Africa by way of England.

Queen and Peasant Equal.

Speaking of the impending death of the Queen this morning, the Bishop of Ottawa said that precisely the same burial office would be used for Her Majesty as for the humblest peasant in her realm. In regard to memorial services he had no doubt that Her Majesty's subjects, everywhere, whether Christian or Mohammedan, would find expression in the trust and most appropriate way for their sorrow at the loss of one who has been so much to the whole Empire and almost to every family. His Lordship did not know what the precedents were for such an occasion, or what others might consider the most suitable way of commemorating the Queen's death; but his own personal feeling was that in God's house there ought to be no real mourning in social and domestic life there would no doubt be varied expressions of genuine sorrow and mourning, but in God's house our attitude should rather be that of humble, hopeful, happy triumph over death and all that death entails.

No Special Cables.

The news of the Queen's illness is being received at Government House in the ordinary telegraphic reports. No special cables have been sent from England in connection with the matter. It is probable that in the event of the Queen's death special word will be sent to the Government House.

The children of the public schools could think of little but the Queen's health this morning, and in many of the classes the day was begun with the singing of "God Save the Queen."

Lord Minto Sends a Message.

Lord Minto, at the request of the Government yesterday sent a message to Mr. Chamberlain, expressing sorrow at the serious illness of the Queen and extending sympathy to the members of the royal family.

ANXIETY AT VANCOUVER.

Business Almost Suspended Over the Queen's Critical Condition.

Vancouver, Jan. 22.—Anxiety over the condition of the Queen overshadowed private and business considerations throughout British Columbia yesterday, and in the city of Vancouver, as in other cities and towns of the Province, the usual avocations have been almost suspended. Constant streams of anxious-faced citizens have been scanning the bulletin boards from an early hour.

Telegraph and newspaper offices have been besieged by those desiring to receive confirmation of their

worst fears, and as each brief bulletin was published, its nature could be judged without referring to the text by the brightening or the clouding of the faces of the watchers in this Western country.

In official and semi-official circles preparations were made during the day for the worst eventuality. At the City Hall, Mayor Townley had laid aside all ordinary municipal business in order that nothing that the occasion demands might be left undone to testify the deepest and general sadness.

Arrangements were made that all bells throughout the city should be tolled immediately upon receipt of official intimation of Her Majesty's demise, at whatever hour of the day or night the dreaded tidings might come. All merchants in the city will close their places of business for 24 hours in token of the general mourning, and citizens generally will be expected to assume mourning for a period of one month. During this time flags will be displayed at half-mast.

The civic and official period of mourning will extend also for one month, and all social and festival arrangements will be postponed until the expiration of 30 days.

All Quebec in Sympathy.

Quebec, Jan. 22.—The Queen's serious illness is the leading topic of interest here, and has evoked the sympathy of all classes. The latest reports from Cowes are eagerly sought.

Messages From the Antipodes.

London, Jan.—The Colonial Office has received despatches from the Governments of Australia and South African colonies, expressing their anxiety and distress at the Queen's illness.

NORTH BRUCE CASE AGAIN.

Further Particulars Filed Against Return of Alex. McNeill, M.P.

Toronto, Jan. 22.—Further particulars were filed yesterday on behalf of Petitioner Campbell, who is trying to unseat Alex. McNeill, M.P., for North Bruce. They are numbered 33 and 34 respectively. Charge 33 is to the effect that at polling station No. 2, Division of the Township of Amabel, Deputy Returning Officer Charles Cartwright absented himself from the poll, and during his absence two votes were recorded, the ballots being initialed J. C. by the poll clerk, instead of C. C.

Charge 34 alleges that at polling station No. 3, Division of the Township of Elderslie, Alfred Fraser, of the said township, farmer, was allowed to vote, though not named on the voters' list, the ballot being given him by William Harris, deputy-returning officer, through inadvertence or ignorance.

Venezuela Affairs Critical.

Port of Spain, Trin., British West Indies, Jan. 22.—The arrivals to-day from Venezuela confirm the critical state of affairs in that republic. A former Venezuelan Minister asserts that the politicians at Caracas are making a determined raid on the Bermudez Asphalt Company. He adds that they tried it before on a modest scale, squeezing \$300,000 out of the company, but that United States Minister Loomis protested and stopped further action of this description. The Government of the Minister also says, listened to reason then, but has now lost its head through greed, and offers to restore the company's property for a million dollars, although it is said to have been illegally taken by a dictatorial decree.

Four Senators Appointed.

Ottawa, Jan. 22.—It is understood that Hon. Lyman Jones of Toronto, Mr. A. T. Wood of Hamilton, Mr. George McHugh of Victoria County, Ontario, and Mr. Robert Mackay of Montreal have been appointed to the Senate. Mr. Jones takes the place of Senator Ressor, who resigned his seat in the upper chamber recently on account of ill health. Mr. McHugh obtains the seat vacated by the death of Sir Frank Smith. Mr. Wood succeeds the late Senator MacInnes. Mr. Mackay is given the seat which Senator Ogilvie relinquished.

Storm Destroys Bananas.

Kingston, Jamaica, Jan. 21.—Terrible weather has prevailed on the north side of the island since Friday night. A violent norther has been causing destruction of banana plantations on every side. In some of the parishes hundreds of acres of fruit have been swept away. The course of Bluff Bay River has been diverted, and the swollen stream has already carried away two houses, and is now threatening to wreck a large, thriving fruit district. The seas are running mountain high and have demolished the wharves.

Young Man Torn to Pieces.

Corning, N. Y., Jan. 22.—Olney Oshlager, aged 21, met a horrible death in a sawmill at Caton, seven miles from here, last night. His father, who was in charge of the circular saw, noticed him alongside the machine. He turned away for a moment, and as he looked up the boy was whirled up with the belt and torn to pieces in the shafting and pulleys.

Lattimer Men Again on Strike.

Hazleton, Pa., Jan. 22.—The 1,500 men employed at the Lattimer colliery of G. Pender & Company struck yesterday because of the alleged unwarranted discharge of two drill runners and the company's refusal to reinstate them as requested by a committee of mine workers.

Collision in the Mersey.

Liverpool, Jan. 21.—The steamships Cymric and Carib Prince collided in the Mersey on Saturday. The Cymric's port quarter deck was damaged, and the plates were stove and the rail was carried away. It is said she has a hole in her stern 12 by 21 feet, reaching to the main deck. The Carib Prince's bowsprit was carried away, and some of her plates were stove in. The collision occurred while the Cymric was crossing the river to land cattle. A strong flood tide was running, driving her into the bows of the Carib Prince, which was lying at anchor.

Carrie Nation Set Free.

Wichita, Kan., Jan. 19.—The County Attorney has dismissed the charge against Mrs. Carrie Nation of the W. C. T. U., who was in jail here nearly a month for breaking saloon fixtures in a temperance crusade.
