HELD JOINT CONFERENCE

Missionary Workers of London Exchange Views.

Encouraging Reports and Bright, Helpful Addresses Were Delivered.

A conference of the various Women's Missionary Societies of London, the first of its kind ever held in this city, took place yesterday afternoon and evening, the afternoon meeting being held at Wesley Hall, First Methodist Church, and the evening meeting at St. Andrew's Church. All the local circles of women's missionary work were represented, together with many of the city church workers. Reading of papers of a most interesting nature and reports on the missionary work done by different denominations constituted the business of the afternoon.

The different reports given afforded pleasing reading, showing as they did the good work done by each and every denomination represented. Missionaries sent out by the various churches are operating in India, China, and other parts of the globe, while in Canada also good work is being done among the Indians, Chinese, Japanese, Doukhobors and other deserving races. Especially during the past year has the work gone on splendidly.

At the afternoon meeting Mrs. J. H. McMechan occupied the chair. After the usual opening exercises, Mrs. Barker, of Harding Hall, gave a paper on "Inspiration and Power," in which she said that the Holy Word was the best source of inspiration and power. Secret communion with Christ was another great source by which Christians might be inspired and given power to do good.

Mrs. T. S. Johnson read the report on Baptist missions. Ontario and Quebec were the only provinces in which active home mission work was being done by the Baptist societies.
