

## A REPRIMAND FOR ROUDNEFF PARIS TO HONOR GEN. STOESEL

Russia Expresses Regret for Poster Incident. Huge Preparations Are Being Made for the Event.

### 160 KILLED IN WARSAW RIOTS TO GET GEM-STUDED SWORD

A State of Siege Has Been Proclaimed in Cities of Warsaw, Lodz and Libau. Young King of Spain, Soon Due in French Capital—Queen Amelia to Study Medicine.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 30, 11:45 p.m.—The day here was passed in perfect quiet. A report that a bomb was thrown at the Governor-General's residence is unfounded.

Interest has been transferred from St. Petersburg and Moscow to Warsaw, Lodz and Libau, where a state of siege has been proclaimed. The Government has been general and large factories are guarded by troops. Part of the electric light plant has been destroyed by strikers.

In the rioting at Warsaw on Sunday at least 160 persons were killed or wounded. The strike continues unabated, and business is paralyzed. However, the crisis is by no means passed, and there is great apprehension here with regard to what the night may bring forth, especially if the attempt to disable the lighting system should be successful. The Warsaw demonstrators evidently are in an ugly mood. Count Lamsdorff has hastened to reply to Ambassador Harding's note, expressing regret if the British consul-general and vice-consul at Warsaw were injured, and informing him that an immediate inquiry would be made to establish the facts.

The public reprimand administered to Deputy Chief of Police Roudneff, of Moscow, on account of the posting of the anti-British telegram has been delivered, and in Government circles it is thought to be severe enough to satisfy British opinion. It is thought that this step, by circulating the reprimand in provincial administrations, will prevent further attacks or insinuations against foreigners, and will remove the incident from the realm of diplomacy.
