Ottawa, June 29 .- (By the Canadian Press.)-The net quantity of coal made, during the month of March was greater; by 644,000 tons than during the preceding month, and was 29 per cent higher than the average amount made available during March in the three preceding years. The output from Canadian mines increased 8 per cent, or more than 100,ono tons, above the production in February, and was 13 per cent higher than the average record for the same month in 1919-20-21. Production during the three months of the calendar year to date was practically the same as the average for the period in the three pre-
