Shrewd Lawyer Makes Discovery

Most of the secret of a successful want ad sale of household goods—the contents of a home—is a sufficiently detailed want ad. This means a want ad running to quite a number of lines. Its size will get for it favorable attention among other ads, thereby insuring that most will read. A curious psychological trait of the public enters, too. A large want ad indicates a "big" event So people want to go to it, and because they do it really becomes a "big" event.

Another principle enters. A shrewd lawyer, who had occasion frequently to use want ads as an administrator, was known for the uniform great success of his sales. He had simply discovered that the bigger his want ad,

and the more detailed his listing of articles, the greater the number of people who attended. He abandoned "contents of one house," "other articles too numerous to mention," etc., and specifically named the articles. It only takes a single article to make a person visit a

sale of household goods," he explained. "The more different articles you mention, the more people are thus attracted. The average woman comes for one particular article, perhaps two -she has seen them listed in the want ad. Then, while she is at the house, she buys others."

Mention first in your want ad the newest, most popular pieces of furniture—that recently-bought overstuffed parlor set, for example; the splendid phonograph; the dining suite you have been so proud of; the modern range. Put the most

desirable offerings first. Then list numerous other articles. Remember, as the lawyer was wont to say, it only takes one article to bring a buyer to the sale. When the buyer is there, he will, if an average person, at least consider, very

One man replied to a household goods want ad because he had seen a crosscut saw listed. He brought home, besides the saw, a tent, a fishing rod and tackle and a dresser. That's typical. That's why it pays to list many, even small articles, in the household goods want ad.
