New Premier of Quebec Is Elected by a Very Large Majority.

Outbreak of Smallpox in New Brunswick Greatly Alarms Authorities.

Montreal, April 10.—Hon. Somer Gouin, the new premier of Quebec, was elected for St. James' division of Montreal to the Quebec legislature today by a majority of 2940 over A. St. Martin (Labor).

Halifax, April 10.—The management of the Cumberland Coal and Railway Co. and its miners have struck an agreement and the threatened strike has been averted.

Quebec, April 10.—Dr. F. Gilmore, surgeon dentist of New Brunswick, who has been practicing here with Dr. Laffrey, while suffering from nervous prostration jumped from Dufferin Terrace to the rocks below yesterday and was dead to death. Almost every bone in his body was broken. He was 36 years old.

Charles DeChane, about 26 years old, probably was fatally stabbed by Louis Madard, 22 years of age, early Sunday morning in a saloon in St. Marie as the result of a row over a woman. Both men were intoxicated at the time.

Chatham, N. B., April 10.—Nine cases of smallpox have broken out here. The authorities have issued orders to close schools, churches and public halls.

Winnipeg, April 10.—Chas. Cavers and William Summers, the men injured today by slipping on a boom at the new C. P. R. hotel, are both dead. Summers came here from Montreal last year.

The Canadian Pacific sent out orders today all over the line to rush 100 coaches to St. John, N. B., to accommodate the week's arrivals from immigrant ships.

Winnipeg is now the third largest telephone exchange in Canada, the total number of circuits being five thousand. Sixty circuits are now employed. Seven hundred phones were added during the last six months.

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Reinforcing Togo's Fleet

Athenian Brings News of Third Japanese Squadron's Departure.

Survivors of Port Arthur's Siege Arrive by Liner from Asia.

Steamer Athenian brought advices yesterday of heavy reinforcements of the Japanese squadron in preparation for the coming winter. The warships, which had been watching the blockade-runners—two work more difficult now that the ice is leaving the northern waters—has been given over to old-style coast defense vessels of the type of the Akusasu, long on duty in northern waters, and the Ilyei and Anagi. The fighting vessels of modern build have been ordered south. A number of fast passenger steamers have also been converted into cruisers and added to Vice-Admiral Kato's fleet. It is believed that he will hoist his flag on the cruiser Kasuga, one of the two vessels which he is to command just prior to the commencement of the winter campaign.

The Japanese fleet, with Togo, Kanamura and Uruin commanding the various sections, has been watching the Straits of Sumatra and Java, and between the latter island and the Celebes; the steam whaler Orion, which arrived a few days ago from Christiania, Norway, but is now the property of the Japanese, is on Togo's way being overhauled and cleaned. The little vessel, more like a steam yacht in appearance, has been much admired as she lies on the cradle at the harbor. The Orion is similar in every detail to a fleet of steam whalers now being operated from Shimoda and Moji, in the interest of Japan. She will be fitted with the whaling appliances which are expected to arrive today or tomorrow from the China Mutual steamer Ping Suey.
