Rubbers on the Carpet

Many housekeepers will welcome the suggestions given below by an extensive traveller. Suppose, however, a woman returning her visits enters ten houses in an afternoon. It would mean that she must put on or take off her rubbers twenty-two times during the afternoon, and her gloves would be ruined in the process. On a reception day a boy or maid would be required for the "rubber office" alone, or else a notice might be put outside: "Kindly use the doormat before entering." I cite this merely as an example of what might occur. Perhaps some women readers will give their opinion on the subject, for there is a real grievance. The letter is as follows: "Some Americans, and especially Canadians, have a habit which, if practiced in Europe, would be considered an insult. I have noticed several times that people who ought to know better will come right from the dirty street into my drawing-room without taking off their rubbers. "Rubbers and overshoes had better be left in the hall; they are certainly never intended for the parlor rug. "An Extensive Traveller."

When oilcloth has been down for a few months and is losing its shiny surface, it can be renewed easily and made to last twice as long if treated in the following way. Melt a little ordinary glue in a pint of water, let it stand on the top of the oven till dissolved. Wash the oilcloth thoroughly and let it dry. Then at night, when the traffic of the day ceases, go over the whole carefully with a Hannel dipped in the glue water. MASSACRE ISLAND

Descriptions of the Interesting Purchase in Lake of the Woods

An interesting purchase was made by the Historical Society of St. Boniface, when they bought at a nominal price, from the Dominion government, the famous Massacre Island at the Lake of the Woods, where the explorer, Sieur de la Verandrye and his 21 companions, including the Jesuit missionary, Rev. Father Aulneau, were martyred at the hands of the Sioux Indians. It will be remembered that the remains of this little band of heroes were discovered by the Jesuit Fathers of St. Boniface on the site of the old Fort St. Charles on American Point, in the Lake of the Woods.

It had been learned from historical documents that the bodies of the martyrs had been removed to Fort St. Charles for burial and this led to the expedition which ended in their discovery, and the tracing of the site of the old fortress. The bones and skulls of the martyrs, together with many curios found on the historic site, were brought to St. Boniface college.

Massacre Island, included about 66 acres, and is in Canadian territory. The massacre spoken of above, and after which the island was named, occurred on the 6th of June, 1785, June one and three-quarter centuries ago.

GERMANS WANT SPORT

Movement to Introduce Athletics into the Colleges and Universities

There has been begun at Berlin University a movement destined to work great changes in the traditional routine of undergraduate life at German universities. Representatives of fourteen universities, ten technical colleges, and a score of minor institutions met to discuss ways and means for introducing sports and athletics into German universities on English lines. The project has long been mooted, but never before seriously taken up. This time it gives promise of something like practical realization. The delegates at the Berlin meeting pledged themselves to make a vigorous propaganda among their fellow-students, in the hope that it may be possible next year to hold at Leipzig a great inter-university meeting to be known as the "German University Olympics." This is to be resumption of an old idea.

CANADA'S GAIN

During the past week over 8,000 artisans and agriculturists from Scotland have embarked for Canada. All of the immigration agents of the various colonial dominions are reporting an extraordinary demand for passage from prospective immigrants, and it is said that the present steamship lines will not be able to handle much more than half of the traffic during the coming season.
