The divisional court, Toronto, heard the following case: Acton vs. Parker, on Tuesday before Justices Falcon-bridge, Britton & Clute. An appeal by two plaintiffs from the judgment of the County Court of Lambton of the 12th of June, 1912. An action to recover \$500 damages alleged to have been caused by defendants fraudulently stating the age of a horse sold by them to plaintiffs to be only thirteen years, while knowing it to be much more, and declining to furmsh pedigree of horse as they were alleged to have agreed to do.
