#### Reorganization of 27th Regiment

Reorganizations of the 27th Lambton Regiment has started, with the dropping ont of two captains and seven lieutenants. Saturday's Canada Gazette promulgates the retirement of Capts. N. D. Rougvie and J. D. Waddell, with effect from September 5 last. These officers were appointed provisionally on a former reorganization of the unit, January 15, 1914 but did not qualify for their rank.

This leaves but three captains on the active list, while the establishment calls

This leaves but three captains on the active list, while the establishment calls for eight, and no doubt Lieut.-Col. W. MacVicar has already taken steps to fill these vacancies from the junior ranks.

The lieutenants who go on the retired list are L. B. Morrison, E. D. Fletcher and A. C. Ellis. Mr. Fletcher was appointed before the war, and the other two in 1916, but apparently did not qualify. Four lieutenants resign their commissions in the militia: A. D. Williams, W. G. Connolly, G. G. Garvey and G. W. Towse, These are qualified and some of them have had overseas service.
