Luke 10. 1-11, 17-20.

GOLDEN TEXT.—The harvest truly is great, but the laborers are few.
—Luke 10. 2.

MEMORY VERSES, 2-6.—Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send labourers into his harvest.

Go your ways: behold, I send you forth as lambs among wolves.

Carry neither purse, nor scrip, nor shoes: and salute no man by the way.

And into whatsoever house ye enter, first say, Peace be to this house.

And if the son of peace be there, your peace shall rest upon it: if not, it shall turn to you again.

LESSON STORY.

Jesus did many wonderful works while he lived upon earth, but he spent the greater part of his time in teaching and preaching.
