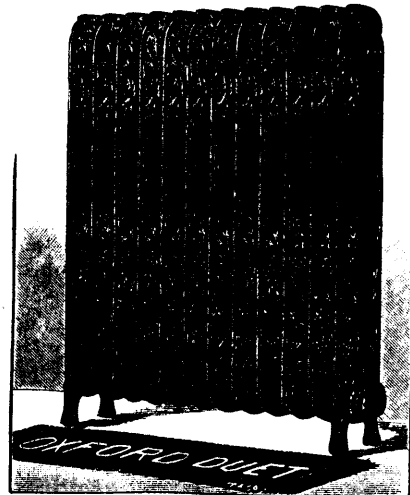

In honor of Miss Sinclair, who returns to India shortly, a large audience recently assembled in St. Peter's Church of her native village, Madoc. Mr. A. F. Wood, ex-M.P.P., Superintendent for many years of the Sabbath School in which Miss Sinclair received some of her training, presided. Suitable addresses were delivered by the Rev. J. A. Claxton, Rev. Geo. L. Johnston, Rev. D. Wishart and E. D. O'Flynn, Esq. 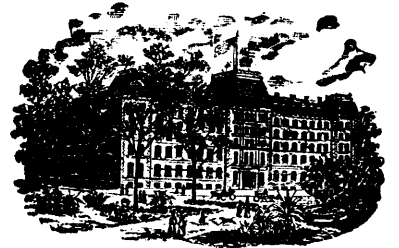
