the African, Peruvian, East Indian, Spanish, and other foreign sheep, as horses, there is no doubt but what our wool might still be greatly improved. Perhaps artificial means might be employed to render wool sher and longer, in the same manner as for human hair, which in the course of two or three generations would become natural to them.

## MISCELLANIES.

Electrical machines are now made of wooden cylinders covered with glazed filk, inflead of glafs cylinders, which is a great improvement, as they can thus be obtained of any fize, and infinitely cheaper than formerly. Neither will they be liable to be broken.

A remarkable ftrong and durable lime may be made, like ftone itfelf, by mixing manganese with it, and employing it immediately. It may be ftained of all kinds of colours, and made to resemble the finest sculptured marble, by being put into moulds and left to dry.

It is faid that Mr. Tunberg, Engineer to the King of Sweden has invented a Hydrofcope with which a perfor can view the bottom of the fea 'at a great depth. A boy with hydrofcopic eyes died not many years ago.

Several ladies in the Electorate of Hanover have brought the art of embroidering with hair, dyed of all kinds of colours, to a great degree of perfection.

Au immensely profitable manufacture might be established in England of decomposing and obtaining all kinds of falts in fystematic order. By expofing any acids in necessaries during hot weather, a great quantity of fal ammoniac may be obtained, and the offensive smell be corrected.

Ferlons who cannot afford to have feather-beds, and yet wifh to lie light, may lopply themfelves with a large leather bag, in the fhape of a tick, very tightly lewed together on all fides, which is to be blown up with a pair of bellows to a certain pitch, and clofely flopped, fo that no air can efcape. The prelent Emperor of Germany is faid to have made use of fuch a one in his travels in preference to other bedding.

Mr. Puymarin's difcovery of the art of engraving upon glafs with the fluor acid, may perhaps be capable of being extended to a great variety of other fubftances, fuch as cornelians, and other flones for feals, the precious flones and even diamonds, for they all contain a quantity of filecious earth. It is pollible that many curious antique feals have been engraved in this manner.
