INTERNATIONAL BAZAAR AT CANADA HOUSE

For the first time the diplomatic corps of Delhi cooperated together in organizing a sale of foreign goods for the benefit of various Indian charities. With the flags of all the nations represented in Delhi around the fountain at the entrance to Canada House, nearly 9,000 people visited the International Bazaar on November 27. Fifty-six countries set up stalls on the lawns and from the sale of their national products raised over Rs. 200,000. From this fund many charities will benefit including the Indian Red Cross, the Home for the Blind, St. Stephen's Hospital, Holy Family Hospital, the Y.W.C.A. and the Commonwealth Women's Association. The Bazaar was opened by the Vice-President, Shri G. S. Pathak. At his visit to the Canadian stall the Vice-President tried on a Canadian Ojibway Chief's head dress.
