PUBLICATIONS RELATED TO THE COMMONWEALTH AND/OR TO DEVELOPMENT ISSUES

The **COMMONWEALTH DAY POSTER** for 1993: depicts a number of the issues that are major concerns of the Commonwealth. Its reverse side emphasizes the human values on which the Commonwealth is based. Available from the RCS/CLU, at no cost.

COMMONWEALTH CURRENTS: a lively news magazine published every two months by the Commonwealth Secretariat. It reports on the work, achievements and concerns of the Commonwealth. Distributed in Canada by EAITC and available at no cost.

COMMONWEALTH DAY HANDBOOK FOR SCHOOLS (1992 edition; about 90 pages): a well-presented book outlining a variety of activities that schools could use on Commonwealth Day.
