Clark Urges Humanitarian Measures in Sri Lanka

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Right Honourable Joe Clark, today expressed his concern over continuing instances of human rights abuses in Sri Lanka and the attendant erosion of the rule of law. Mr. Clark also pointed to growing shortages of food and medicine in northern Sri Lanka as causing severe hardship to the civilian population.

"While there has been some improvement in the general human rights situation in recent months, it is evident that a greater commitment will be required to ensure respect for the law and to bring the perpetrators of human rights to justice. It remains the ultimate responsibility of the Government of Sri Lanka, as the duly constituted authority, to ensure that rights are respected and to set the patterns of conduct for others to follow," Mr. Clark said.

With the current intense fighting between the Sri Lankan army and the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) there have been a significant number of civilian casualties resulting in a major exodus from much of the northern region. The distribution of food and medicine has become increasingly difficult. The population is suffering from hunger and starvation and from a virtual absence of medical services.
