To-day being the first day of the meeting of the First Session of the Eighteenth Parliament for the Despatch of Business, Arthur Beaudesne, Esquire, C.M.G., M.A., K.C., F.R.S.C., Clerk of the House of Commons, and Thomas Munro Fraser, Esquire, LL.B., Assistant Clerk, Commissioners appointed by *Dedimus Potestatum* for the purpose of administering the Oath to Members of the House of Commons, all attending according to their duty, the said Arthur Beaudesne, Esquire, C.M.G., M.A., K.C., F.R.S.C., laid upon the Table a List of the Members returned to serve in this Parliament received by him as Clerk of the House of Commons from and certified under the hand of Jules Castonguay, Esquire, the Chief Electoral Officer, which said Certificate and List is as follows:—

## EIGHTEENTH GENERAL ELECTION

## OFFICE OF THE CHIEF ELECTORAL OFFICER

This is to certify that since the dissolution of the Seventeenth Parliament on the fifteenth day of August, 1935, writs of election, dated on the said fifteenth day of August, were issued by His Excellency the Governor General for the election of a member or members for every electoral district in Canada, such writs being severally addressed to the returning officers mentioned in the attached list and directing the nomination of candidates to be held either on the thirtieth day of September or the seventh day of October, and the poll, if required, on the fourteenth day of October of the said year.

And that thereafter by reason of the acceptance of office of profit under the Crown of three of the members elected under such first mentioned writs, further writs of election were issued for the election of members for the electoral districts
