

2. Has the government reached or is it considering negotiating an agreement with respect to this airport and, if so, on what date will it take effect and for what period of time?

Hon. Jean Marchand (Minister of Transport): 1. The government has not made funds available for (a) the installation or (b) the maintenance of the municipal airport of Bergeronne. The Ministry of Transport provided \$12,000 for improvements to the runway and this is expected to be paid in the near future.

2. The municipality of Grande Bergeronne has not approached the Ministry of Transport for a further agreement with respect to this airport.

LIP GRANT FOR INNOVATION QUEBEC PROJECT

Question No. 1,003—**Mr. Lambert (Bellechasse):**

Has the Department of Manpower and Immigration made a LIP grant for a project under the name of *Innovation Québec* whose address was 4101 Jarry East, Montreal and, if so (a) what were the names and addresses of the promoters of the project (b) what was the amount of the grant (c) to whom were the cheques issued (d) on what date and in what amounts?

Mr. Mark MacGuigan (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Manpower and Immigration): (a) The sponsors of the project were Mr. Marcel Ducharme, President, of 8400 23rd Avenue, St. Michel 456, and Mr. Fernand Laliberté, Secretary, of 7490 22nd Avenue, Montreal 453. (b) The Department made a grant to a project entitled *Innovation Québec* under the 1971-72 Local Initiatives Program. The grant was initially for \$112,320 for the period February 14, 1972, to May 31, 1972, which was subsequently increased on April 21, 1972, to \$131,976. On May 30, 1972, the project was extended to September 30, 1972, the contract value being increased from \$131,976 to \$317,304, and on September 21, 1972, a further extension to November 30, 1972, was granted, the contract value being increased to \$408,968. 2. Of all claims disqualified in (a) 1971 (b) 1972 how many resulted in application of penalties?

Mr. Mark MacGuigan (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Manpower and Immigration): 1. It is not possible to determine the unpaid benefits resulting from disentitlements. There is no way of knowing how long the disentitlement actually lasts. Claimants may stop reporting to the Commission when they find they are ineligible for benefits or perhaps they have found work. Therefore benefits not paid because of a disentitlement cannot be measured.
