The Honorable Mr. Bureau moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Penny,

That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that he will be pleased to cause to be laid before this House, copies of all documents and pleadings relating to the questions decided by the award rendered at Halifax, on the subject of the indemnity of five million five hundred thousand dollars, under the Treaty of Washington, particularly the twenty-second and twenty-third articles of that Treaty, and all copies of all letters and despatches between Her Majesty's Government and those of the United States of America and of Canada on the same subject since the rendering of the award.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the

affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. Miller moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Dickey, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, all surveys and reports made by any Government Engineer within the last six years, in relation to the breakwater at West Arichat, in the Island of Cape Breton.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the

affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Mr. Montgomery,
The House adjourned.
