

EXPORT SALES OF MANITOBA WHEAT

Reported Heavy Demand Gives Impetus to Prices at Chicago.

CHICAGO, Sept. 16.—Big export sales of Manitoba wheat at the board today... Closing prices were 1-1/2 to 1-3/4 over last night.

Flurry in Corn. In corn, as in wheat, there was a bullish flurry after midday. The Iowa State report indicated that the yield would be lighter than expected.

Manitoba flour—Quotations at Toronto are: First patents, \$5.50, in cotton 10c more; second patents, \$5, in cotton 10c more; strong brands, \$4.50, in cotton.

Beans—Imported, hand-picked, \$2.50 to \$3.00 per bushel; Canadian, hand-picked, \$1.75 to \$1.90; primes, \$1.60.

Manitoba wheat—New crop, for September shipment from Port William, No. 1 northern, \$2.75; No. 2 northern, \$2.60.

Peas—No. 1, \$3 to \$3.50, nominal, per bushel, outside.

Wheat—No. 1, \$2.50 to \$3.00, outside, nominal.

GUESSED WEIGHT OF BIG CATTLE

George C. Rowntree Had It Exactly, and Many Others Were Close.

The result of the competition for estimating the weight of the four big cattle exhibited by Messrs. Murray, Patchett & Tappart in connection with the Canadian National Exhibition, has come to hand.

The cattle were weighed in the presence of Messrs. J. H. Ashcroft, manager of the exhibition, and William, live stock reporter, Toronto World, and the total weight was 9000 pounds.

George C. Rowntree, the driver of the Harris Abattoir, was the only competitor to estimate the correct weight, and his estimate was very close to the actual weight.

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RECORD BREAKING RECEIPTS OF CATTLE

Choice Butchers Firmer—Lambs, Sheep and Calves Steady—Hogs Lower.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Yards were the largest on record of any market in the Dominion.

There were 242 cars received, comprising 7000 cattle, 2961 hogs, 2783 sheep and lambs, 87 calves and 409 horses.

Prices for good to choice butchers' cattle were firmer, but the market for medium grades was unchanged.

Sheep, lambs and calves held about steady, but the market for hogs was lower.

Butchers' receipts were 4600 to 5000 head of cattle, 2000 to 2500 hogs, and 2000 to 2500 sheep and lambs.
