Our West-India Privateers have taken ample Satisfaction for past Injuries, as Spain, in that Part of the World, gives them a large Field.

'Tis not impossible but some Ships have been taken by consent, in order to defraud the Insurers.

I submit it, if many of our Ships have not been insured by Foreigners.

On a Review of the foregoing Account, it appears that we have taken from Spain, from July 1739, to July 1741.

7 Men of War

6 Galleons

31 Privateers

127 Ships

Besides the Forts and Castles, of Porto Bello Chagra, and Cartagena, entirely demolished; and, that they have taken from us

154 Ships.

And, 'tis remarkable, we have not lost one King's Ship, nor above one or two Privateers.
