Reserved seat plan at Nordheimers'. THE ISLAND.



YACHTING IN ENGLAND. London, June 2.—It was fine to-day as the yachts started in the races of the Royal Harwich Yacht Club this morning. In the race for large raters the Britannia led the Hester, Satanita and Alisa in the order named across the starting line at 10 o'clock. In the 20-raters' class, the boats started at 1030 in the following order: The Saint, Perditä and Niagara. The Alisa ran ashore at 10.30 o'clock and remained fast half an hour. In the first round of the 20-rater race the Saint finished at 1.41.47, the Peni-tent at 1.52.33, and the Niagara at 1.58.03. The Britannia won the race for the large raters, crossing the finish line at 4.18.34. The Satanita was second, finishing at 4.39.25, and the Alisa third, 44.108.
