The present case differs from others because here the plaintiff has as much means as ner nusband, and she can take the ordinary legal steps to enforce her right to receive half the rent of the joint property. In the learned Master's opinion the whole matter is really more a quarret than anything else. Charges of adultery are freely made, but in her affidavit the plaintiff confesses she does not know of any specific acts. He feels compelled to refuse the motion, but without costs. He concludes with the following wholesome words of advice to the parties: "It is to be sincerely hoped for the Interests of both parties that some arrangement may be effected, and that what would have been a comfortable provision for their declining years may not be wasted in litigation, which will inevitably be costly to a degree far beyond the inexperienced expectations of either plaintiff or defendant. I think the action is frivolous and that the motion by the wife should be refused in her ewn interest."
