Toronto Eight to Pull for Grand Challenge Cup.

DOMINION BYE-ELECTIONS

Leighton McCarthy Carried North Simcoe, but the Liberals Won All the Other Contests.

BAGOT GOES TO THE LIBERAL SIDE.

Dr. Willoughby Again Bitten in East Northumberland, and by an Increased Majority.

Five bye-elections for the House of Commons took place in the Dominion yesterday, viz. two in Ontario, two in Quebec and one in Prince Edward Island.

In North Simcoe, Ont., the contestants were Mr. Leighton McCarthy, a nephew of the late D'Alton McCarthy, who ran as an Independent, and Mr. James Martin of New Lowell, Liberal. The vacancy was made by the death of Mr. D'Alton McCarthy. The result is the election of Mr. McCarthy by 218 majority, with a few polling sub-divisions yet to hear from.

At the general election in 1896, Mr. D'Alton McCarthy, Independent, polled 2237 votes, Mr. E. Stewart, Liberal, 1410, and Mr. H. Lennox, Conservative, 875. Number of voters in the riding 7281.

In West Lambton the vacancy was caused by the appointment of Mr. J. P. Lister, Q.C., to the bench. The candidates yesterday were John Farrell, Conservative, and Dr. Johnson, Liberal, and the result is the election of Mr. Farrell by a majority of 941. Sarnia and Point Edward also polled up a majority of over 500 for the Liberal.

At the last general election Mr. Lister polled 2998 votes, Mr. A. G. Dewar, Conservative, 1711, and Mr. J. Hanna, Conservative, 878. Number of voters in the riding 7688.

In Montserrat, Quebec, the election was due to the elevation of Mr. P. A. Choquette to the bench. Mr. LeBlanc, Conservative, defeated Mr. Choquette, Liberal, by a majority of 600. The Liberal was elected by about 600 majority—returns not complete.
