Count von Brockdorff-Rantza u To Proceed To Berlin To *Confer With the Chancell or, Who Will Return To Versailles If Conditions Are Accepted.

Paris, June 6.-When the Germans are handed the Allied reply to their counter proposals they will be informed, according to French circles, that the discussion has been finally closed, and will be given no less than three or more than five days in which to accept or reject the conditions.

Count von Brockdorff-Rantzau, the head of the German peace mission, is expected to leave immediately for Berlin to confer with Philipp Scheidemann, the German chancellor. If it is decided that Germany shall sign the treaty, the count will return to Versailles. If Germany refuses to sign, notification of her r fusal will be sent from Berlin, it is said.


