Powerful belts pressed closely together and driven by a gasoline engine, which is part of the machine, constitute the pulling mechanism of the Vessot machine, which was hauled by a Cleveland Tractor. The Tombyll machine, which resembles a grain binder in appearance, and is drawn by horses, relies on heavy rubber cylinders revolving inwards in an upright position to uproot the flax, which is then carried by canvas carriers up to the binding board. The Tombyll machine had the advantage of reels to bend the flax towards the pulling mechanism, but in the demonstration did not harvest as clean a swath as the Vessot. 
