### WIND UP RUGBY SEASON WITH TODAY'S GAME

The last and probably the best rugby game of the season will be staged at Scarborough Branch this afternoon. Hamilton Tigers II are bringing down their strongest aggregation in an endeavor to overcome Excelsior's two-point lead and carry the inter-city rugby championship back to Hamilton with them. These two teams met in Hamilton last Saturday and after an hour of high-class rugby, Excelsior were on the long end of a 3 to 1 score. This is a pretty fair indication of how evenly the two teams are matched.  
That Excelsior are deserving of public support in their endeavor to land a rugby title for Toronto can be readily seen from a short review of what they have accomplished. This is the second year in succession that Excelsior have won the Toronto City League championship. During these two years they have played twelve games, winning eleven and tying the other. In the five games played this season Excelsior have hung up a total of 77 points, while their opponents have only been successful in gathering 12 points between them. This in itself is a good indicator of the high class of rugby played by the local team and it should be worthy of support from local rugby followers.  
The game is called for 2:30 and should be a battle all the way. Advance notices from Hamilton are to the effect that a large delegation of supporters will accompany them in their hunt, and Excelsior are looking for a large crowd of local supporters.

### RACE EIGHTY DAYS DURING THE YEAR

English Season Will Open at Warwick in March—The Dates.  
London, Nov. 30.—The great success which attended English flat racing during the season which recently closed, brought every encouragement to owners, trainers and breeders throughout the country. In spite of many difficulties the sport was enjoyed without interfering in any way with government rules and regulations. The use of the railways was barred, but the thoroughbred jockeys and patrons of the turf journeyed to the various racourses by road, every kind of motor vehicle being used. This has resulted in a big let-up in the restrictions for next season, for which 30 days flat racing have been arranged for. The season will open up at Warwick on March 23. Birmingham has been allotted two days, Brighton two, Gatwick three, Haydock Park two, Leicester three, Lewes three, Lingfield three, Manchester five, Newmarket 22, Nottingham three, Salisbury two, Stockton three, Warwick three, Wolverhampton two and Worcester two and Windsor three. The stewards of the Jockey Club, in publishing the list of fixtures, wish to state that they submitted to the government the details of all courses on which meetings were held in 1915 and that the fixtures have been allotted with the approval of the war office, board of trade, ministry of munitions and the railway executive.
