Woman suffrage.

Municipal ownership of all franchises.

Public ownership of all water power.

Public ownership of all nickel, other mines, and their refining in Canada, with a complete record of all output.

will go into the junk heap very suddenly, much, perhaps, to their chagrin, and the less to the welfare of the body politic and to the strengthening of the ability of Canada to deal with the conditions in which her people find themselves as the result of misgovernment in the past, and the new conditions brought about by the war.

We have hardly begun to discuss the possible planks of a new platform, except that we have indicated that a sweeping reform in our currency and banking practices is called for; that the whole railway question has to be reopened and be settled more or less along lines of nationalization; that the natural resources of the nation and of the provinces must be conserved for the people, and not taken for the exploiters; that parcel post and rural delivery must be extended and improved; that better and cheaper loans for farmers by the aid of the state and the province must be provided; that the civil service must be taken out of politics; that the defence of the country and organized and more clearly defined; that many changes for the benefit of those who have to work for their livelihood, must be set on foot; and that in many other directions new laws and new men are absolutely necessary for the new Canada that will emerge out of this war, and out of the misgovernment that has taken place in the past.

## EX-ALD. T. DAVIES HAS PASSED AWAY

Prominent in Municipal Life in Toronto Many Years Ago.

GOVERNMENT PIONEER

Was Originator of Board of Control and Present Civic System.

In the death of ex-Ald. Thomas Davies at his residence, 56 Wellesley street, at 10 o'clock last night after several months' illness of a general decline, Toronto has lost a worthy citizen. He was elected alderman in the year 1873, and he helped in purchasing the Furness waterworks, which became a municipal franchise. He was honored many years with a seat at the council board, and on many occasions acted as mayor. He was one of the originators of the local improvement by-laws, which enabled the city to construct improved pavements and sidewalks all over the city. He was also the originator of the board of control and our present system of municipal government. His honor of moving the resolution that gave Ryerson Park its name, and was one of the chief promoters of the straightening of the River Don. His name occupies a place on the tablet of the city hall and is also embossed on "Big Dave's" street.

Mr. Davies was born in Davieville March 25, 1845. His father came to this country from Cheshire, England, in 1832. He was educated at the Park School, which was carried on by the first Jesse Ketchum, prize, Model School and Upper Canada College. Mr. Davies was prominent in the Masonic fraternity, being a life member of King Solomon's Royal Arch Chapter and was past master of Orient Lodge, A. F. & A. M. He was also a life member of the Sons of England and St. George's Society and was made an honorary member of the Foresters.

He was married in 1877 to Margaret Henderson, daughter of the late Alexander Henderson, J.P. He is survived by his widow and four sons, Dr. T. Alexander Davies, Arthur H. Davies, Franklin J. Davies and Gordon Davies, and three sisters, Mrs. William Thomas, Mrs. T. B. Taylor and Miss Patricia J. Davies. Mr. Davies was for many years assistant superintendent of the Berkeley Street Methodist Sunday School and at his home in the square Presbyterian Church.

## SERBIANS MAKE FURTHER GAINS

### Two Villages Captured From Bulgars in the Region of Florina.

which each side took part. Two Bulgarian counter-attacks in the sector of Vetrinik were repulsed by the fire of the Serbian cannon.

"On our left wing the enemy has undertaken no counter activities in the direction of Florina."

The British official statement, issued at Kermanshah, says:

"On Sunday night our pickets east of Orjak bridge (on the Struma, near Lake Tuhino), were attacked by the enemy, who were repulsed."

The enemy camp at Prosenik was bombed on Sunday by our aircraft, apparently with successful results. There were no developments on the Doiran front."

Berlin's Statement.

A statement issued by the German War Office today says:

"Front of Field-Marshal von Mackensen the allied (Teutonic) troops penetrated at several points into the Russian-Romanian position mentioned in yesterday's report."

"Mackensen's army has developed around Florina and along the Struma."

The official report from Berlin on

Monday said that the Russo-Romanian forces on the Achova-Bobind-Talka line had received reinforcements. The line held by the Russians and Roumanians parallels the railroad running from Tsernavoda to Constantza, on the Black Sea coast. The only bridge across the Danube in this region is at Tsernavoda, which is about nine miles up the river from Rachova.

Fighting in Streuel Valley.

The Roumanian war office communication issued today says:

"On the north and northwest fronts there was skirmishes of slight importance along the whole front, except in the Valley of the Streuel River, where the enemy attacked vigorously with superior forces in the face of which we fell back slightly."

"On the south front along the Danube there has been an exchange of gunfire. In Dobrudja Sunday night enemy attacks toward Enigae, southwest of Kobadia, were twice beaten back. The fighting continues."

# WAR SUMMARY

## THE DAY'S EVENTS REVIEWED

In their encircling movement on Monastir, in the Saloniki theatre of the war, the Serbians continue to drive the Bulgarians before them in the district of Florina, capturing Krushegrad and Neokazi, five and six and a quarter miles northwest of Gornichevo, and pushing forward their cavalry to Rosna. They have also occupied the highest summit of the Kaimakalan Range, a point that the Bulgarians had been ordered to hold till the last man. They are still proceeding with their advance after defeating Bulgarian counter-attacks.

The capture of Monastir, on which the allies are converging, would give them several advantages, including the control of a road leading into the heart of Serbia. By striking for the valley of the Vardar from the Plain of Uskub, the Nish-Saloniki railway could be cut, forcing the enemy confronting the British forces and a portion of the French on their right wing to retreat to avoid envelopment. A few miles further to the northwest lies Nish, ancient Serbian capital, and a junction point on the Berlin-Saloniki railway. The allies have against perhaps a third of that number of Bulgarians. So they should political effects of the cutting of the Berlin-Constantinople railway, now menaced by the allies, would be tremendous, it must be expected that the Germans will make every endeavor to counter the allied thrusts. At present Von Mackenzen, the German general, is engaged in the Dobrudja in pursuit of elusive victory over the Roumanians, chain of field fortifications that is reputed to be a strong defensive may serve to divert Von Mackenzen from his Roumanian enterprise. In that event the Russians and the Roumanians can remove the Bulgarian coast towards Constantinople and turning the Balkan range. They have also the choice of advancing up the Danube towards Belgrade.

A heavy rain fell in France yesterday and put practically an end to artillery fighting on the front south of the Aisne and the Somme, but the positions, villages, highways and railways without cessation of German Most significant is the report coming by wireless from Germany that the headquarters of the great purpose of waging a big eastern offensive. The first part of the report concerning the transference of the headquarters of the first is probably true enough, for the Germans have already been defeated severely and perhaps irreparably in the west, and they must sooner or later retreat, but an offensive campaign in the east. It is conceivable, however, that with the loss of their petrol supplies from Roumania, the Germans may have to drop everything and open a big offensive against Roumania to secure the oil wells in order to stave off utter collapse of their motor-transport system and, with the collapse of their far-flung battle lines. If this is so, it has hardly escaped the notice of the allied strategical control board and disposition may be expected to be taken to counter this campaign of despair. But the hints about the undertaking of a campaign in the east allowed to be published in the German public mind for the coming retreat from France and eventually from Belgium, following upon the irresistible advance of the allied armies.
