VICTORIA.—GENERAL RULE.—*Taxation of Costs*.—It is
Ordered, that the following Regulations be observed in the
Office of the Clerk of the Pleas:—

1. Every Affidavit used before the Clerk, on the Taxation of Costs, must be retained and filed on a File to be kept
for this purpose.

2. The name of witnesses, the days of attendance and
allowance of each witness, to be specified in every Bill of
Costs, and for taxation.
