

WAR MEDALS

May Introduce Bills in U. S. Congress for New Decorations. American Field Headquarters, France, Nov. 28—One result of the recent visit of American congressmen to the front

may be legislation granting a new medal to American soldiers for deeds of brav-It was reported today that several of the representatives had announced their intention to introduce bills at the December session of congress providing for two new military decorations.

There was no intention on their part to displace the present congressional medal of honor as the highest of all awards for gallantry in action or of conspleuous services in time of war.

But the congressmen who favor the additional awards, believe there should be two new medals for recognition of expeditionary army heroes—medals which could be awarded on the field, and which would correspond to the French Croix de Guerre and Medal Militaire and the British Distinguished Service Medal and the Militaire Country of the th vice Medal and the Military Cross. As it stands at present, American sol-liers' bravery can be recognized only by award of a departmental medal, or,

after passage of a special act of congress, by the medal of honor. Legislation creating medals of equal value to the British, French, Italian and other Allied government awards would still further serve to put the American soldier in the comradeship of the men he is to be fighting with henceforth.


