## TO TRAVELLERS.

For the information of Travellers between

Windsor and Parrsborough, &c.

THE Parrsborough packet sails regularly between Windfor and Parrsborough every week, from the first of April to Christmas, vizt : leaves Parrsborough on Monday, wind and weather permitting, so as to be at Windfor on Tuesday; and will fail from thence the first high water that happens at or after eight o'clock in the forenoon of that day : the packet frequently goes twice or three times a week, when business requires it.

The vessel is upwards of fifty tons burthen, and has very good accommodations for passengers; and likewise for carrying

horses, neat cattle, and sheep.
