PRICE TREND IS IRREGULAR AT MONTREAL

Brazilian Is Active Leader
With Alcohol and
Power

SELLING PRESSURE IS
HEAVY IN NEW YORK

Dupont and Telephone Yield
a Point; Others, However,
in Small Advances

MONTREAL, Oct. 18.—There was a fair volume of trading on the local stock exchange during the first half hour this morning, with prices revealing an irregular trend. Brazilian was again the active leader and after opening unchanged at 10 1/2, this issue moved to 10 1/2, but in later trading eased a half to 10 1/4. Alcohol and Power were the other active issues, the former going up a half at 2 1/4, while the latter was steady at 7 1/4. Smelters in light trading advanced a quarter to 2 1/4. Laurentide lost a half at 10 1/4. Steamship preferred moved down a quarter at 8 1/4, and Power preferred and Winnipeg Electric sold unchanged at 50 1/2 and 57 1/2 respectively.

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—Resumption of selling pressure sent stocks irregularly lower at the opening of today's market. Dupont and Independent Telephone each yielded about a point, and Hudson yielded fractionally to a new low level for the year. Archison and United Drug each advanced about a point.

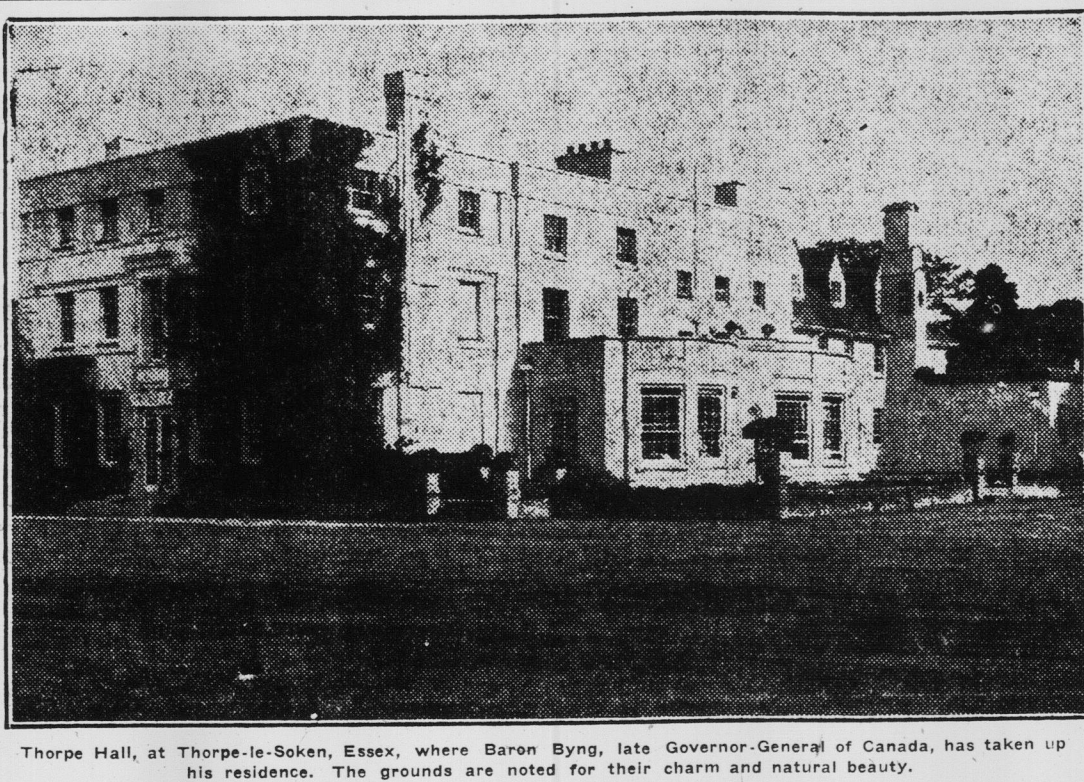

CATHOLICS SEE NO CHANGE IN MEXICO

Say President's Decree on Clergy
Limit Does Not Alter
Former Situation

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 18.—President Calles' new proposal to limit the number of priests and ministers permitted to function within the Federal district to ninety for each religious group, is looked upon by Roman Catholics merely as a reaffirmation of his frequently expressed determination to enforce the religious clauses of the constitution. In Catholic circles, where there never has been much serious expectation that Congress would amend or repeal these religious clauses, the prospects are now considered even more gloomy. It is felt, however, that the religious deadlock, which has held since August 1, when Catholic priests withdrew from their churches in protest against the government's regulations, will not be altered by the new proposals which supplement the original regulations promulgated by President Calles.

MCGILL WON AT RUGGER.

MONTREAL, Oct. 18.—The McGill-English Rugger team took the first step towards being the challengers for the MacTier Cup, when they beat the M. A. A. by 5 to 3 on Saturday afternoon at the M. A. A. ground. The match was hard fought from beginning to end, and was every bit as close as the score suggests. The M. A. A. did the greater part of the pressing, particularly in the first half, but their failure to score until nearly the end of the game was particularly due to the energetic defence and hard tackling of the McGill team.

TO BOX DONOVAN

George Barber, Toronto Mitt
Wielder Here in November

WAS OVERSEAS MAN

Philip Tubb Had Won Corporal's
Rank in France

Philip Tubb, returned soldier, who was buried beneath the debris when a building in Mill street collapsed on Saturday, was in his 88th year and leaves his wife and a three-month-old child. In addition, two brothers, John and Thomas, of Mount Hebron, Kings county, survive. The funeral will be held from Chamberlain's Undertaking Parlor on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Mr. Tubb was a First Lieutenant in the United States army, and was with the 16th Battalion. He won the rank of corporal in France, where he was badly wounded.

Langstroth, at the Wayside Inn, Hampton. The funeral will be held on Tuesday at 2:30 p.m. at St. Andrew's church, French Village, and interment will take place in Hammond River cemetery.

Aged P. E. I. Priest Dies At Morrell

CHARLOTTETOWN, P. E. I., Oct. 18.—Rev. D. J. Gregory Macdonald, 81, said to be the oldest living member of the Catholic clergy in Prince Edward Island, died yesterday at Morrell. He was ordained in the Sulpician Seminary at Montreal, where he finished his education in 1871. Returning to his native province, he became successively pastor of the churches of St. Columba, St. Margaret's, St. Paul's and St. George's. During the latter part of his life he lived in Charlottetown, but took up residence at Morrell some years ago.
