## LABOR LEADERS FORM PLANS TO FINANCE STRIKE

Union Workers To Con-  
tribute 5 Per Cent.  
of Wages

### ARRANGE LOANS

Branches Are Not So "Broke"  
As Is Popularly  
Believed

LONDON, May 8.—British Labor General Headquarters at Euston Square Friday completed plans for financing the general strike. The general council of the Trades Union Congress, which is the governing body of the strike, ordered all union workers remaining at work to contribute 5 per cent. of their wages.

These contributions go to the general strike fund, which will be administered by the council. In addition, officials of the striking unionists now are arranging for large bank overdrafts which if effected will be mortgages, first, on their invested savings, and second, on membership dues which will be collected over a number of years to come.

### UNIONS NOT "BROKE"

According to labor informants, the great British trade unions are not nearly so "broke" as is popularly believed here. It is true that many unions are extremely short of ready cash, but according to labor general headquarters officials, they will be able to obtain cash advances on long standing sound investments in government security and valuable real estate and on future union dues. Regarding the potential value of the latter, it was pointed out, merely by way of example, that

a union with membership of a half a million workers contributing twenty-five cents each week has an annual total of approximately \$36,000,000.

## 22 DROWN IN FLOOD

Overflow of Volga River Causes  
Serious Damage in Nijni-  
Novgorod

MOSCOW, May 8.—Twenty-two persons have been drowned in floods caused by the overflowing of the Volga River. Much damage has been done between Yaroslavl and Nijni-Novgorod, where the water is at an unprecedented height, covering a tract of country 20 miles wide. The water is covered with the wreckage of houses and cattle carcasses. Several steamers are carrying on salvaging operations.

## NORTH POLE HOP IN 60 OR 70 HOURS

Dirigible Arrived at Spitzbergen  
in Time to Escape  
Storm

OSLO, May 8.—A message to the Attenposten from Spitzbergen, says the Amundsen-Ellsworth dirigible Norge arrived at King's Bay just in time to escape a snowstorm. The weather was clear until Thursday night, when an inch of snow fell. The flight from Vadsø, Norway, to King's Bay took 16 hours. The Norge is now being refitted with hydrogen and polar equipment is being installed in preparation for the dash into the uncharted Arctic regions. The explorers hope to make the flight from Spitzbergen to Alaska, in from 60 to 70 hours.

## JOSEPH LEITER AND SISTERS LOSE SUIT

Appellate Court Overrules Decision  
Which Involves More  
Than Million

CHICAGO, May 8.—Reversal of the decision of Judge Dennis E. Sullivan in Superior Court by the Appellate Court has deprived Joseph Leiter and his sisters, trustees of the \$15,000,000 estate of Levi Z. Leiter, of \$1,000,000, 214.33.

The dispute arose over the purchase of the Ziegler Coal Mines from the estate of Joseph Leiter, with payments extending over 20 years. Mr. Leiter insisted that the interest on the sum paid was interest on the estate and should be added to the estate.

It is expected that the case will be carried to a higher court by Joseph Leiter and his associates.

## RATES REDUCTION MOTION SUBJECT

Hon. H. H. Stevens Wants  
Copies of All Correspondence  
Produced

OTTAWA, Ont., May 8.—The question of the reduction and equalization of freight rates to and from the Pacific coast is the subject of a motion for the production of papers, which has been placed on the order paper of the House by Hon. H. H. Stevens, Conservative, Vancouver Centre. Mr. Stevens asks for a copy of all correspondence and official documents which has passed between the government of British Columbia or Premier John Oliver of that province, and Premier King or the Minister of Railways and Canals, in this matter, since April 1, 1925. A copy of all orders-in-council on the subject passed since that date, is also requested.

## Retail Trade Here Shows Improvement

WINNIPEG, Man., May 8.—The weekly trade report of the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association, Limited, reads: "Saint John—Wholesalers report only a fair volume of business being done, while retail trade is showing improvement, but slowly. Collections slow."
