WALKS TO MCGILL AND TELLS

Paris, Aug. 23—(By the Associated Press)—The supreme council tonight sent the following note to the Hungaring government, in which announcement as made that the council would have no dealings with a government headed by Archduke Joseph or any other member of the Hapsburg family:

"The Allied and associated powers have been further considering information derived from our reports, and from other sources as to recent events in Budapest. Their conclusions are as follows:


