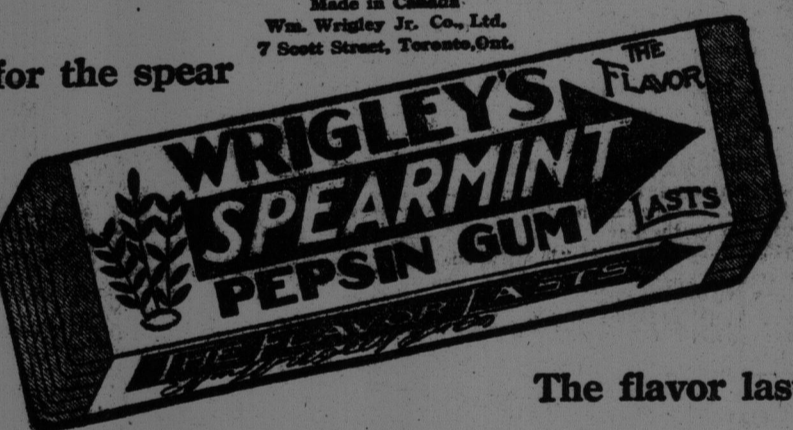

Let me answer your question Yankee-wise by asking if you have ever read what Oliver Wendell Holmes says about the confusion and misapprehension which are likely to occur among the six, when any two people are talking together.

"Breakfast Table" was so startled at his statement as you were at mine, and he hastened to prove his sanity by explaining that these six personalities were:

- 1. The real John; known only to his Maker. 2. John's ideal John; never the real one and often very unlike him. 3. Thomas' ideal John; never the real John, nor John's John, but often very unlike either. 4. John's ideal Thomas.

The Curse That Has Followed the Family of The Duke of Cumberland

In these days of scientific investigation, it seems like an anachronism to speak of a genuine family curse. And yet the terrible death of young Prince George William of Cumberland, killed in an automobile accident while spending through Prussia to attend the funeral of his maternal uncle, King Frederick VIII. of Denmark, is looked on as showing that the curse which has overshadowed the Cumberland family for many long years, is still fully active.

It will be remembered that when Queen Victoria ascended the throne of Great Britain and Ireland, a separation from the Kingdom of Hanover, to which until that time, it had been united, took place, since the Salic law-debarring woman from succession, prevailed in Hanover.

At the death of King William IV. of England, he was followed upon the throne of Hanover by his younger brother Ernest, fifth son of George III.

Duke Ernest, who had until then borne the title of Duke of Cumberland, was without exception the most execrated member of the English reigning family; and that for more reasons than one. Moreover, that he had blood on his hands cannot be doubted, although to this day, the murder of which he was accused, and which brought down the curse upon him and his house, has never been fastened upon him.

At the time I am speaking of, Duke Ernest of Cumberland had in his service a young valet named Senila, who one morning was discovered lying naked in his room, adjoining his royal master's sleeping and dressing rooms, pierced through and through by a sword unfortunately belonging to the duke.

When questioned, he denied all knowledge of the affair, saying, however, that the struggle between Senila and his assassin must have taken place in the dressing-room opening into his own sleeping chamber.

The king's coroner, a member of the royal household, hastily summoned a jury, who returned the verdict that Senila had committed suicide. It was asserted that he had seen one of the countless ghosts of murdered persons well known to haunt St. James' Palace, and had in a sudden attack of madness taken his own life.

But unpleasant rumors continued to be whispered from month to month, and finally it was said that Senila had been killed by some secret directly affecting him.

All this might have been forgotten, had it not been for an incident which occurred a little later in the same street. Duke of Cumberland was slowly walking towards his residence, when a woman, evidently a foreigner, and with her snow-white hair and portion of her almost un-wrinkled face covered by the loose folds of a black shawl, suddenly stood in his path, striking at him a flood of accusation and denunciation, and crying aloud that he was the murderer of her son.

The crowd that quickly gathered, as it always does on such occasions, was startled by the tall royal prince cowering before the little woman in black, his face grey as saffron, his eyes half closed, and his hands extended before him, as in a self-protection or entreaty. Just then also the police arrived just in time to hear her utter the curse which still lies so heavily on the Cumberlands.

For Senila's widowed mother was said to have seen the duke, upon his children, and his children's children, to the third, fourth, and fifth generations, the most bitter revenge Heaven could wreak upon them.

She was seized with belated zeal the day after the law and born away to a place of safety, for the mob was beginning to grow, while the duke disappeared, and the world at large was left to call its own conclusions from what it heard afterwards, here, there and everywhere.

Incredulous as one may be, the fact remains that this curse does not seem to have been spoken in vain, for poor Senila the royal master was from that moment as he himself expressed it, "pursued by Buries that scarcely let him rest."

King George of Hanover, who distinguished himself throughout his reign as one of the most gallant and chivalrous of rulers was stricken with total blindness in his infancy, and lived to lose two thrones, those of Hanover and of Brunswick; his grandson, the present duke, was born disgraced, and saw his features to plastic surgery, and now his eldest great-grandson is being brought home, crusted and unrecognizable, from the little Prussian town of Friesach.

Universally popular, and positively adored by his people, this charming Prince George had already suffered his full share of the "Curse of the Cumberlands." It would seem, a few years ago the scratch of a rusty nail resulted in such a serious case of blood poisoning, that his life was despaired of. Hardly convalescent.

Daily Hints For the Cook

MARBLE CUSTARD CAKE. Grate enough marble sugar to make one cup and cream it with two-thirds cup of butter, add half a cup of sweet milk, two well-beaten eggs and two cups of flour sifted with three level teaspoons of baking powder. Bake in layers.

FILLING FOR CAKE. Heat one and three-quarters cups of milk to scalding point, add a rounding teaspoon of cornstarch made smooth in a little cold milk and cook five minutes, add one egg beaten with a rounding tablespoon of grated maple sugar and cook until thickened. Add a little vanilla flavoring when cool, then spread between the cakes.

GINGER SQUARES. Cream one-half cup of butter, add one cup of sugar, two well beaten eggs, two

cup of flour in which three level teaspoons of baking powder are sifted and one and one-half level teaspoons of ginger. Roll out in no roller at hand, mark in criss-cross one-half inch thick, cut in three-inch squares and crease with grooved roller. Bake in a moderately hot oven. If there is no roller at hand, mark in criss-cross rows over the top with a knife.
