WHAT A WOMAN CAN DO.
More than twenty years ago we lost our father under painful circumstances. For a time mother was prostrate with grief, but having a family of eleven to provide for she roused herself. Two of the boys were serving an apprenticeship; one of the girls worked in a spinning mill; a third worked part of the day, and went to school the other part, while a fourth, who was delicate, received a small sum weekly for services rendered during the day in a minister's family. Five had still to be provided for. Mother went out as a charwoman for years, keeping the boys at their trades, and doing the house work for her own home. In the evening she made and made her family chargeable to the parish. The cost of her devotion is the loss of her eyesight, but she feels proud that by the help of God she has been able to keep her family from being burdensome to others. —Mary A. Anderson.
