Editor Times:—
Sir,—One who signs himself "Anti-Commission Plan." rushes into print in a letter in this morning's Standard, in a defence of the aldermen and their methods, as a "reply" to references I made in the Times yesterday about some of the matters dealt with at board meetings this week. Apparently the member of the Standard staff, from which the letter no doubt emanated, labored hard and earnestly yesterday afternoon with some of the city officials to try and offset the effect of my statements.

Regarding that recommendation to sell the city building on Main street for \$3,400, I would just ask—Why is this matter revived again after it was settled by the council last year deciding not to sell? Why is the purchaser so anxious to get it if it is going to cost him so much more as the Standard alleges? And I might point out that the city pays \$50 rental to the dominion government for the whole of Fort Howe, of which the lot that the building stands on is a very small portion, and not "\$50 for this property which is part of Fort Howe," as the Standard states. The assertion that \$80 taxes would be collected is ridiculous.
