


## SOLID FOR PROHIBITION

Speaker in Toronto Says the Hosts of Organized Labor Standing in Firm Support of Enactment.

(Toronto Globe.) Characterizing as "untruthful" the statement that organized Labor was opposed to prohibition, Congressman John G. Cooper of Youngstown, Ohio, a member of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers of America, in addressing a mass meeting held by the World League Against Alcoholism in Massey Hall yesterday afternoon, declared that the organized workers of the United States would never hold the "beer keg as their emblem," and challenged the right of Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, to place the unions' seal of approval on the campaign to modify the existing United States liquor laws to permit the sale of beer and wine.





**ADMITTS POISONING CANDY.**

Mrs. Beard Confesses Maltreating Received by Mrs. Chamurs.

Reading, Pa., Nov. 29.—Mrs. Seneca Beard, in jail here, admitted to a police inspector and two detectives, according to the police, that she sent the box of poisoned candy received by Mrs. Ames Chamurs, a neighbor, last week. The motive, she is alleged to have said, was the fact that she had lost most of the petty lawsuits which she and the Chamurs and others had engaged in before an alderman. She finally concluded that the law was against her and decided to seek revenge along her own lines.

Mrs. Chamurs suspected the candy was poisoned when she received it and turned it over to the police, with the result that Mrs. Beard was arrested on suspicion.

Mrs. Beard, the police said, admitted she bought rat poison, placed it in the candy, mailed it and then went to see her husband, who is ill in jail. Mrs. Beard has considerable property and is the mother of seven adult children.

**FROM PRIVATE SHELVES.**

Lending Library Experiment in London Suburb.

London, Nov. 30.—(By Mail)—George Bernard Shaw has accepted an invitation to open a public library on new lines of organization in Letchworth Garden City, on December 4. He will lecture on Shelley at the opening of the library.

The Letchworth library will be conducted on an American system. The libraries of several residents of Letchworth have been catalogued and their owners have consented to lend any volumes which may be wanted by other residents. Altogether eleven thousand books have been included in the scheme. On a volume being asked for, the librarian applies for the loan of the book and leaves in its place a card indicating the fact that it has been borrowed. The library then lends the book, and is responsible to the owner for its return.

This system has been successful in American cities of small size, where a public library on the usual lines would be difficult to maintain. It secures the circulation of volumes which otherwise might remain unread on the shelves of private libraries. It is said that the objections, which are obvious, are not insuperable in practice.

Rev. J. LeTouche Thompson, Anglican chaplain, arrived in the city on Saturday and has his office in the Church of England Institute. Mr. Thompson has been cordially welcomed by his many friends in St. John.

The special meeting called yesterday morning by Mayor Fisher for the afternoon to consider the appointment of a civic hydro commission failed to materialize owing to lack of a quorum. Commissioners Bullock and Vignore had made previous engagements. The question, however, will come up this afternoon at 3 o'clock.

## LONDON PAYS DEAR FOR FOG IN HEAVY LOSS TO BUSINESS

Shops, Omnibusses, Cabs Feel the Effect of Heavy Weather; Cost of Lighting Become Huge Burden.

London, Nov. 30.—(By Mail)—"C. B." writing in "The London Daily Mail," gives some striking figures on the cost of a London fog.

"To a big town fog is the most expensive of weather—more so even than snow," he says. "First comes the enormous cost of lighting. In London a day's fog means that the gas and electric light companies have to supply gas and electric power to a value of over £7,000 in excess of the normal requirements."

"The loss to those engaged in surface traction is very heavy. Over a hundred fewer people travel by omnibus on a foggy day, and the total loss in omnibus and tramway fares during a day of thick fog is reckoned at about £20,000."

"Cabs also are heavily hit. It is estimated that twenty-four hours' fog costs the taxicab drivers at least £200 in fares."

"The railway companies serving London suffer severely. In one recent year the shareholders of the Great Eastern Railway, so their chairman told them, lost £40,000 in dividends owing to fog."

"It is reckoned that each foggy day in winter means an extra £10,000 expenditure by the companies serving London. The only transportation company that profits by fog is the Underground, which gets most of the traffic that would otherwise have gone by bus or train."

"But all these various losses added together are trifling compared with those suffered by shopkeepers, especially in the West End."

"Women will not shop on a foggy day, and small business for them. The grocer and butcher supply their goods much as usual, but the 'luxury' shops are empty when fog hangs thick over London. The big department stores and drapers say their business is cut from 20 to 50 per cent."

"Careful estimates put the loss to the West End trade of London at not less than £80,000 per foggy day. One alone of the big food stores in the West End decreases by £2,000 a day of fog."

"The loss in the city through delays and cancellations of appointments must also be heavy, and even now we have not taken into consideration one of the heaviest items of all—that of soap and water."

"When you consider that an average thick fog deposits six tons of dirt on each square mile of London it will be something appalling."

**NO BIG WAR POSSIBLE FOR YEARS, SAYS HARVEY**

"Dominion of Common Sense" Attained, He Asserts, and People Refuse to Fight.

London, Nov. 30.—Colonel George Harvey, the American Ambassador, speaking last night, referred to what he called "the commonplaceness of great events."

He pointed out that during the last six weeks there had been a general election in England, tremendous events in the Near East, with the deposition of the head of one of the greatest religious sects of the world, the Fascist revolution in Italy and other important occurrences, and he added, "upon my word, we have paid not much attention to any of them."

Even more remarkable, there had been no bloodshed. He deduced from this that the world was tired of killing and that it would be impossible to create any great war for years to come, because the people would not have it.

"A dominion of common sense has come over the world," he declared. "The British and American people were never, since the Civil War, so free from resentful feeling as today."

**FRENCH PLAN WHEAT WEEK.**

Paris, Nov. 30.—A "National Wheat Week" has been organized by the government for January 23-28 in an effort to free France from dependence upon foreign grain for bread and also to develop the colonies by encouraging them to help grow breadstuffs enough for home and colonial consumption.

At which will be outlined the best methods of selecting seed and of intensive farming so as to get more and better flour by these means as well as through improved milling. How to get the most out of your flour in all its uses also will be taught.

Each angle of the subject will be dealt with in the greatest detail by the best French experts. Afterwards means will be studied of putting this collective knowledge to work through legislation, through educational propaganda in the industries affected and through patriotic appeals to the people.

One part of the large group of experts, will deal with the part the colonies are to play in the breadstuffs campaign, particularly the possibilities of Northern Africa.
